Additional informations and changes to the Race Information

As a member of the Abbott World Marathon Majors, the Tokyo Marathon Foundation is committed to promoting DEI (Diversity, Equity & Inclusion) and aims to be the most inclusive race in the world, respecting the diversity and identities of participants.

At the Tokyo Marathon 2025, we will be adding the non-binary option to gender selection and trialing the introduction of Duo Teams, so that anyone can take on the challenge in their own way.

Through these and other initiatives, we aim to create a more inclusive society through Tokyo Marathon 2025, and will promote sustainability efforts aimed at creating a warm and friendly event that takes into consideration people with disabilities and LGBTQ+ (sexual minorities) in particular.

■ Addition of non-binary option

We will add "non-binary" to the gender selection (male/female).

As society as a whole works to create an environment that accepts diversity, a non-binary option will be added to the gender category for general runners starting from this race, which has already been introduced in other AbbottWMM races and will be added to meet the needs of the increasingly diverse runners. Participant lists and records will display "male," "female," or "non-binary."

In addition, as part of our efforts to manage the race in a way that is responsive to diverse gender identities, we have conducted surveys about non-binary people and will provide changing rooms and toilets that are open to all (located at the start, 10.7km finish, and finish areas). We have also offered seminars on LGBTQ+ issues for volunteers and administrators and will continue the educational activities to share accurate knowledge and information.

*What is non-binary?

A sexuality that allows one to fit their gender identity or expression outside the "male" or "female" frameworks.

■ Trial implementation of the Duo Team program

We will be announcing the trial implementation about the Duo team in the general entry, with the aim of providing an opportunity for people with cerebral palsy and other conditions that make it difficult for them to run on their own to take on the challenge of a marathon. Starting time is planned at 9:05 a.m. which is the same as the wheelchair race.

As this is a trial run for this race, recommendations will be made by experienced runners from the Abbott World Marathon Majors.

*What is a Duo Team?

Duo Teams are teams of two runners where one runner pushes a safe, customized special buggy carrying a rider who has a permanent physical disability and cannot walk or run. They have already participated in other AbbottWMM races.

We look forward to hearing about your stories and reasons for taking part in the Tokyo Marathon.

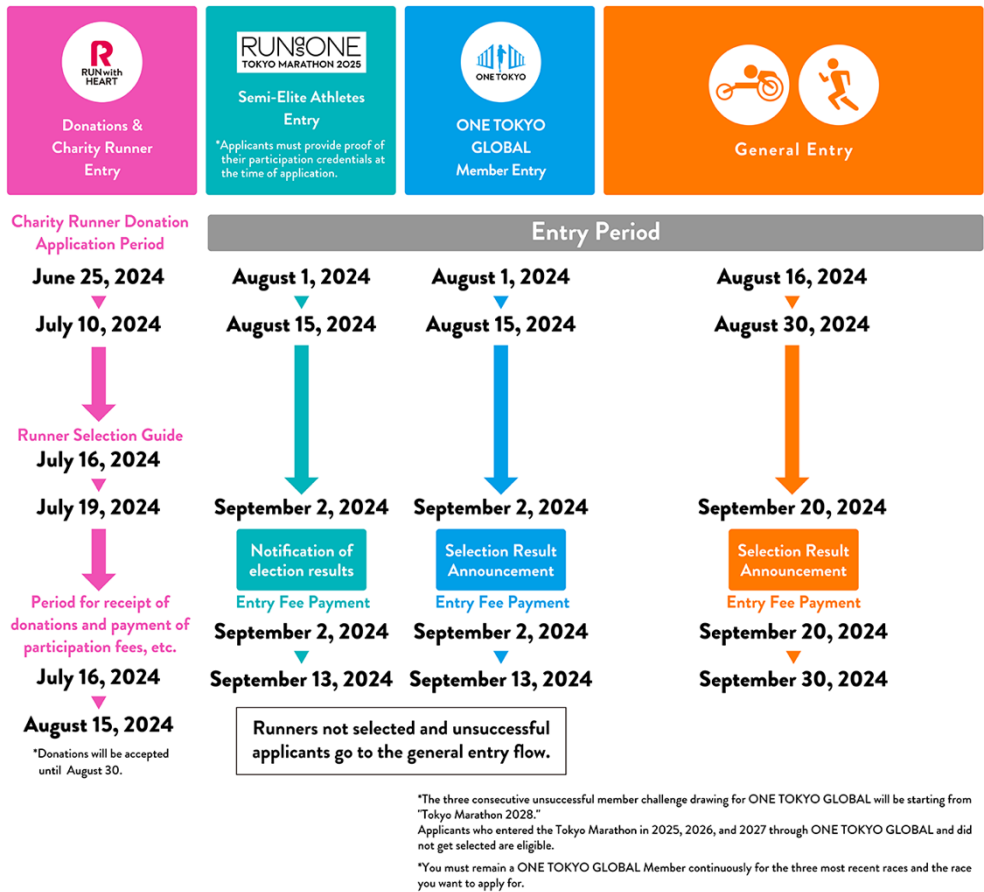

The Tokyo Marathon Foundation Charity "RUN with HEART" has welcomed five new organizations for the Tokyo Marathon 2025 Charity, bringing it up to 37 organizations and 39 programs. Since its launch as part of Tokyo Marathon 2011, the Tokyo Marathon Charity program has collected roughly 4.6 billion yen in donations. Through the activities of individual recipient organizations, it unites the hearts of those who run, support, and cheer on the Tokyo Marathon with those in need, those with hope and dreams, and those working to improve society.

Let's take the opportunity presented by the Tokyo Marathon 2025 Charity to think about how we can promote sports, save the environment, help refugees around the world, provide support to children with serious illnesses, protect animals, and make our world a better place.

4. Examples of how Tokyo Marathon Charity donations are used

Tokyo Marathon Foundation Sports Legacy Program

Through the four keywords and concepts of "Sports Dream (Enhancement and Education)," "Sports Foundation (Facilities)," "Sports Expansion (Public Awareness)," and "The Power of Sports (Contributing to Society)," the Sports Legacy Program aims to create a society in which everyone can enjoy new lifestyles centered around sports, and to pass this society on to future generations. Donations are used for various activities, including the Diamond Athlete Program (organized by the Japan Association of Athletics Federations) that seeks to develop and enhance the next generation of athletes, the Para Athletics Challenge Support EDORIKU Para-Athletics Class (organized by Edogawa City, Tokyo), and the Mini Tokyo Marathon (organized by the Tokyo Marathon Foundation), which conveys the various ways to enjoy and the appeal of sports. Then, we will add the "Support Project for Areas Affected by the 2024 Noto Peninsula Earthquake" as the third Sports Legacy Program to provide support to the affected areas.



Ronald McDonald House Charities Japan

Ronald McDonald House supports children with intractable diseases and their families through contributions and the efforts of local volunteers based on the concept of a "home away from home." It supports families attending on children with diseases both emotionally and economically with large houses that provide private bedrooms, kitchen facilities, living rooms, dining rooms, laundry facilities and play rooms so that families of children undergoing medical treatment can perform daily life activities as they would at home.





